CTAP 6 Offers Technology Integration Projects Technology Enhanced Curriculum Projects (TEC)

TEC participants will attend the four after-school sessions for their chosen project and will also attend the ETC! 2009 Conference on February 28, 2009. The session topics will be guided and planned by the participants and project coordinators. Participants will also get an extra staff development opportunity to attend one technology-related class offered by SCOE prior to June 2009 at no charge (does not include cost of college credit, substitute, or classes that include equipment) and will also receive one Atomic Learning subscription. Interested participants must obtain administrative approval if your site or district will be paying the registration fee.

The Technology Enhanced Curriculum Projects have been designed by classroom teachers experienced with integrating technology into learning. Participants have a choice in the technology they will integrate into their K-12 classroom. This year's TEC project choices are:

- Video Projects in the Classroom
- Podcasting in the Classroom

During the project, participants will be provided with all equipment and online resources needed to develop and teach standards-based, technology-enhanced lessons in their classrooms. At the end of the project, participants will leave with a portfolio of lesson plans from all TEC participants.

Prerequisites

The emphasis is on curriculum and teaching strength, not on technical expertise. This is a project for teachers willing to be role models and leaders using technology. Candidates should :

- Be certificated teachers currently working with students.
- Have basic to intermediate technology skills.
- Have current e-mail and Internet access.
- Have an interest and willingness to serve as a staff developer for the school site and district.

Outcomes

- Participants will become more proficient as they learn new technology skills and apply them to teaching and learning
- School sites and districts will gain a staff developer who can model and share high-quality, standards-based curriculum use of technology

Podcasting in the Classroom

Podcasting is an emerging technology that is beneficial for both teachers and students. Podcasts motivate students to write more and to publish their work for an authentic audience. Teachers can use podcasts to help prepare students for unit studies and to help them review content standards. Topics that will be covered during these meetings will be:

- Finding and using educational podcasts
- Capturing content for podcasting
- Editing audio podcasts
- Publishing finished podcasts to CDs, MP3 players, and online
